

POWERPOINT PICTURE POWER

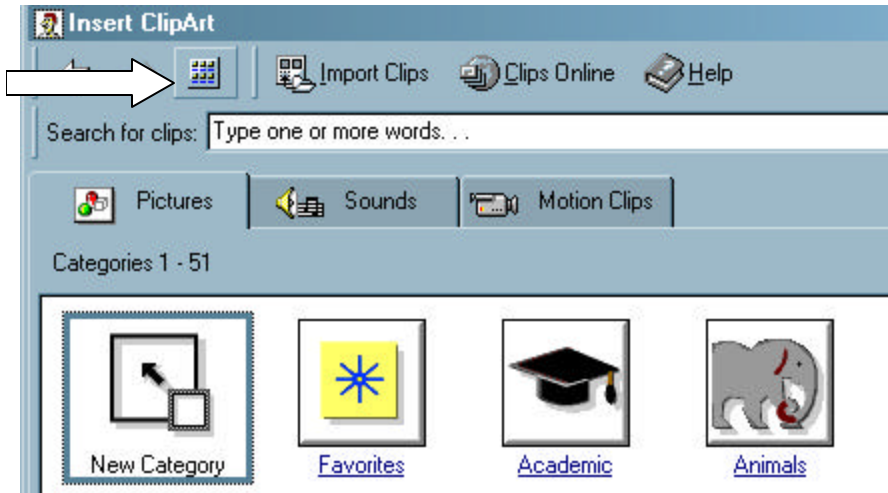
INSERT CLIP ART:

Click on Insert, Picture, and then select Clip Art from the menu.

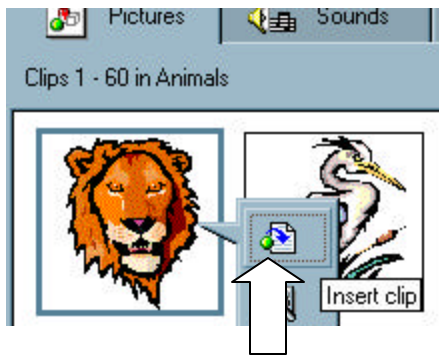


The Insert ClipArt dialog box appears.

Click on a category to see all the different images available.



Select the particular image you want by clicking on it and then select the first button to insert a clip into your PowerPoint presentation.

RESIZE YOUR CLIPART:

Often, clipart is too large for your needs. You can resize it by:

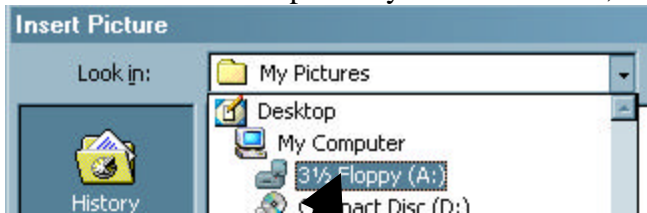
- Click on the image to select it. You should see an outline of a box with little boxes around the edges (these are called sizing handles).
- Move your mouse by one of the sizing handles and the shape of the mouse pointer will change to a double arrow. Now you can easily move the mouse inward to shrink the size of a picture or outward to make it larger.



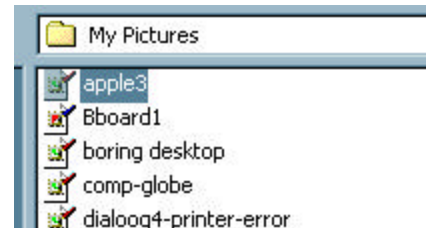
HOW TO INSERT A PICTURE FROM A FLOPPY OR FOLDER:

Click on Insert, Picture and select From File.

Next, Select the location of your image. PowerPoint will automatically open a folder on the hard drive. If the picture you want is there, simply double-click on it.

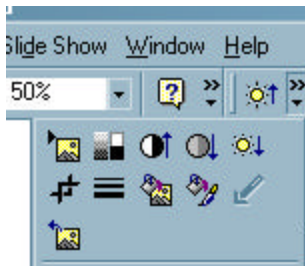


If it is on a floppy disk, then you must click the downward pointing icon in the Look In menu.



Select the drive and then the folder and finally the picture you want. Double-Click on the name of the photo to bring it into PowerPoint. Or you can select the picture and click on the Insert button.

THE PICTURE TOOLBAR:



You can change several areas in your picture by using the picture toolbar options. The most popular options are to adjust brightness or to crop a picture.

CROP A PICTURE:

To crop a picture, click on it and notice the icon for cropping from the picture toolbar. Select the icon and then when you move over a sizing icon the mouse changes shape to look like the crop icon. You may now crop your picture. Move your mouse just like resizing, except the icon is different.
